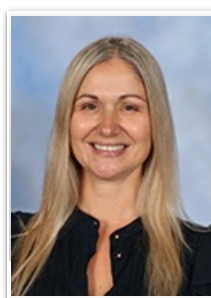
Looking Ahead: Term 3 is packed with important

NEWS FROM HIGH SCHOOL DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Semester Two is well and truly under way as staff and students embark on a new phase of learning. It has been great to see students immersing themselves into new experiences as students from Year 11 & 12 students align new subjects with their community engagement and employment engagement pathways. Additionally, Years 9 & 10 have new elective subjects this semester as they get a taste of what is yet to come in senior schooling. In 2025, our Secondary students have been exposed to Drama, Computer Recycling, HPE, Industrial Laundry, Fitness & Horticulture subjects in addition to their regular core classroom work.

For those that attended our Senior Information session, you would be familiar with the PATH Plans (Planning Alternative Futures with Hope) For our current Year 9/10 families, these meetings are targeted to be set at the end of this term between September 8 – 19 students. PATH plans

are student-centered and created in partnership to detect PATH areas of need and identify the steps of progression as students move through their final years of schooling and beyond for personal and educational goals.

Speaking of future goals beyond school. I am very proud of the fact that many of our Year 11 & 12 students are actively participating in transitional programs independent from school. The great collaborative efforts between school and families has afforded invaluable experiences related to training & skill development on the job, goal setting and familiarisation; to help set these students up for their future. One student has even secured employment for next year through our work experience options. Change is scary and comfortability in change can take a lot of time. So I applaud all involved in getting on the front foot to make these future shaping experiences happen.

As a step to aid transitions as mentioned previously, we will have an excursion taking Year 11 students to the Fresh Futures Expo that will be held in Redlands held on August 27. Thank you to those families that have returned the consent forms. We urge the families of Year 12 students to attend with your young person to an Expo that suits, this will enable you to see the breadth of services available for post schooling.

There are still three Expo dates and locations to check out:

- Brisbane August 20 – South Pine Indoor Sports Complex
- Redlands August 27 – Alexandra Hills Hotel
- Ipswich September 3 – Ipswich Show Grounds

Exciting news for the 2026 Year 12 students in that next year, we will be moving to Senior Jerseys as opposed to shirts for our graduating students. We have been collaborating behind the scenes and the design looks fantastic.

Additionally, senior camp (September 2-4) preparations are continuing. Participating Year 11/12 students would have received further information regarding the packing list, naming items (I urge families to name all items) when luggage can be received by the school and medication handovers (DO NOT leave medications in camp luggage, it must be handed from parent/carer to an Administration Office. This is the same for the collection of medications after camp, the hand over is adult

to adult). You would have also received a slip to return to school, to notify us if your young person is travelling home on Thursday September 4 via the school bus or being picked up. The slip also identifies if you are planning to pick up the luggage/medications on Thursday afternoon or the following week. also.

Finally, on behalf of the all of the staff, students and wider school community, we want to wish our Principal Snjezana and her soon to be husband Matthew, all the very best for their up-coming wedding, amazing trip and of course for the rest of their lives that they have ahead of them together.

Since graduating, Liam's transition has been a resounding success. While there have been moments that required flexibility, each change has been met with resilience. Liam now enjoys a life filled with:

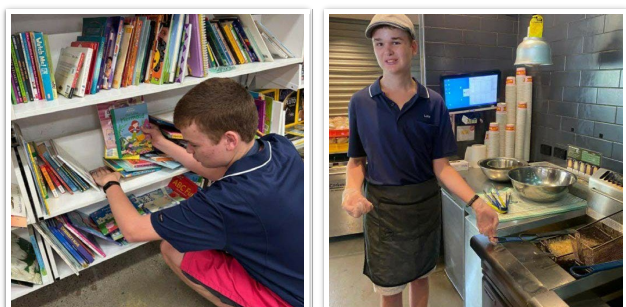
- Structure and routine – essential for his happiness and independence



CELEBRATION FOOD INFORMATION

This policy is important for several reasons:

- **Allergy Awareness** – Many students have food allergies, and having an ingredient list allows staff to check for potential allergens such as nuts, dairy, gluten, or other sensitivities.
- **Food Safety** – Store-bought items are made in controlled environments that meet food safety guidelines, reducing the risk of contamination.
- **Inclusivity** – Pre-packaged treats ensure that all children, including those with dietary restrictions, can enjoy the celebration safely.

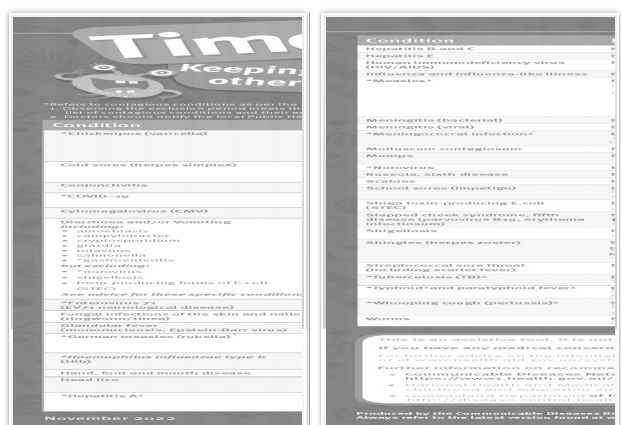
